Horak plea deal stands

Tiffany Horak will not have her plea deal revoked, a judge ruled Wednesday, despite prosecutors' assertion that she gave inconsistent testimony at her husband's rape trial.

Circuit Judge Fred Foreman ruled that Horak did comply with the conditions of her plea deal, even if the testimony she gave wasn't what was expected.

"To a certain extent, she provided compliance with the plea agreement," Foreman said.

Horak, 27, of rural Wauconda, agreed to a 14-year prison sentence last summer for sexually assaulting a young family member. As part of her deal, she agreed to testify against her husband, Carl, at his trial on similar charges.

While on the stand during Carl's trial, Tiffany claimed she could not remember much of what she previously told prosecutors. That led to prosecutor Ari Fisz filing a motion to revoke her plea deal.

Tiffany Horak's attorney, Karen Levi, argued that Tiffany did an adequate job, because the state got multiple guilty verdicts against Carl.

Carl, who was found guilty of more than a dozen child sex counts last month, now faces a minimum of 78 years in prison.
